Research Analysts receive a competitive non-profit salary and generous benefit package and work as part of Tobin's small, mission-driven staff from an office in the heart of Harvard Square.

Please note that writing samples constitute a large part of the decision-making process. Please submit a complete piece of written work (not an excerpt) that marshals evidence in support of an argument. There is no page limit and no need to tailor the topic of discussion to Tobin's research inquiries. Writing samples will be evaluated for clarity of reasoning and style.
